Where did the idea of an Easter bunny come from? What about the Easter egg?

The Easter bunny is really a hare which, according to an Egyptian legend, is a symbol of the moon. Easter falls on the first Sunday after the first full moon that occurs after the twenty-first day of March. Put this together, and we have an Easter bunny.

Early Christians gave new meaning to the Roman proverb *Omne vivum ex ovo*, which means, "All life comes from an egg." A hatching chick represented the risen Christ emerging from the shell of a tomb on Easter morning. Consequently, eggs were prohibited during the Lenten fast and were reintroduced at the Easter meal and also shared as decorated gifts. In 1610, a prayer by Pope Paul V blessed the egg "that it may become a wholesome sustenance to Thy faithful servants, eating in thankfulness to Thee, on account of the Resurrection of Our Lord."

In some parts of the world, children carry baskets and torches and sing Easter carols as they go from place to place. They are given brightly colored eggs to put in their baskets. In other places, eggs are carried to church and blessed by the priests. The eggs are taken home and placed in the center of the table as the main dish at the Easter feast. Visitors to the house during Easter week are offered this sacred food of the resurrection. Happy Easter!

Faith can have the look of high dives and learning to ride a bike without training wheels and life without one's "blankie." All are confrontations with the specter of death asking us to have faith. From youth to old age, our lives seem to be laced with the loss of control, and unless we embrace such moments, not only will we never really grow up, neither will we ever become people of faith who live in the resurrection.

The Easter Gospels are about women and men who arrive at the tomb but hesitate going in; it is the home of death. Yet they become believers after they have entered that home of death and discover it to be abandoned. Over the years, I have become convinced that the only way to become a believer in the resurrection is to walk into the tomb yourself and there discover that where you thought death was present now has been abandoned. That is the pattern of coming to faith.

Usually such moments do not have the look of faith. They tend to seem more akin to death than any promise of new life—like having to move to a new city or a new school, or abandoning an addiction, or confronting a problem through counseling, or aging, or grieving over lost love. They all can have the look of tombs yet they are also where we find the beginnings of new life. Risk it often enough and so discover new life, and we begin to believe in the reality of resurrection—Jesus' and ours. •

DEVOTION TO THE DIVINE MERCY

From 1931 to 1938 Our Lord revealed the secrets of His great mercy also to Sr. Faustina. He designated the first Sunday after Easter as the Feast of the Mercy of God. In preparation of this Feast. He asked that a Novena, which asks for prayers each of the nine days for a different group of souls in order to immerse them in the sea of God's Mercy! Confession is required on the day before this Feast and Communion required on the day of the Feast. Our Lord promised to the souls who follow these requests a complete remission of sin and punishment! "I desire that the Feast be a refuge and a shelter

for all souls," He told her, "especially for poor sinners. The very depths of My Mercy will be opened on that day. I will pour out a sea of graces upon those souls that will approach the font of My Mercy. Tell ailing mankind to draw close to My Merciful Heart and I will fill it with peace... mankind will not find peace until it turns with confidence to My Mercy."

NOVENA TO THE MERCY OF GOD (Begin on Good Friday) FIRST DAY

Let us pray for God's Mercy to all mankind, especially to sinners.

Most Merciful Jesus, *for whom it is proper to be merciful to us and to forgive us, *look not upon our sins, *but upon the trust which we place in Your infinite goodness. *Receive us all into the abode of Your Most Merciful Heart * and do not permit any one to depart therefrom for all eternity. *We beseech You for this through the love which unites You with the Father and the Holy Spirit *in the unity of the Most Holy and incomprehensible Trinity.

...Our Father..Hail Mary..Glory be...
Eternal Father, look down with
Mercy upon all mankind, *and especially upon poor sinners, *whose
only hope is the Most Merciful
Heart of our Son and Our Lord Jesus Christ. *Through His sorrowful Passion show Your Mercy to us
*that we may glorify your omnipotence for all eternity. *Amen

SECOND DAY

Let us pray for the clergy and all religious through whom the Mercy of God descends upon all mankind.

Most Merciful Jesus, *from whom all good proceeds, *increase Your graces in the souls of priests and religious *that they may worthily and fruitfully fulfill their tasks in Your Vineyard, *arousing all by word and example * to a proper devotion to the Mercy of God for all eternity.

..Our Father..Hail Mary..Glory Be..

Eternal Father, look down with Mercy upon the multitude of laborers in Your Vineyard *on the souls of priests, brothers and nuns, *who are the object of the special love of Your Son and Our Lord Jesus Christ. *Grace them with the power of Your blessing* *and grant them light * that they may duly lead the faithful on the way of salvation, * drawing down on them Your Mercy. * Amen.

THIRD DAY

Let us pray for all faithful Christians.

Most Merciful Jesus, who abundantly do bestow upon all *Your graces from the treasure of God's Mercy, *receive all faithful Christians into the abode of Your Merciful Heart *and do not let us depart from It for all eternity. *We beseech You for this through the love *which unites You with the Father and the Holy Spirit *in the unity of the Most Holy and incomprehensible Trinity.

FIFTH DAY

Let us pray for the erring in Faith.

Most Merciful Jesus, Who are goodness itself * and Who do not refuse light to those who humbly seek, * receive into the abode of Your Most Merciful Heart *the souls of those erring in the Faith. *Draw them with Your Light into unity with the Church * that together with us they may praise *the generosity of Your Mercy for all eternity.

Eternal Father, look down with Mercy *upon the souls of those erring in Faith, *and when, abusing Your grace by stubbornly persisting in their errors, *they have squandered this treasure, *look not upon their malice, *but-mindful of the love and the bitter Passion of Your Son, *who before His Passion so ardently begged of You: "That they all may be one" -- *grant that these souls may return to that blessed unity as quickly as possible and together with us may praise Your Mercy for all eternity. Amen.

SIXTH DAY

Let us pray for little children and childlike souls.

Most Merciful Jesus *Who did say: "Learn of me, for I am meek and humble of heart," *receive into the abode of Your Most Merciful Heart * the souls of little children and those * who, like them, have become meek and humble, * thereby enchanting heaven as if by a fragrant crown * laid before the throne of Your Heavenly Father. * Grant that they may constantly dwell within Your Sacred Heart, * therein continually praising the Mercy of God.

Eternal Father, look down with Mercy upon little children and upon all meek and humble souls, *who have become most like unto Your Most Beloved Son, *and who by the fragrance of their virtues ascend to the foot of Your throne. *Father of Mercy, we beseech You through Your love for these souls *and the delight which You find in them, *bless us and the entire world *that we all may render unceasing praise to Your Mercy. * Amen.
