The Synod Evangelization Group will meet at All

Pentecost is the Jewish Festival of Weeks, which can  
be found in the Hebrew Bible. Shavuot called the  
Festival of Weeks and is also called the Festival of  
Reaping or harvest. Jews traditionally read the Book  
of Ruth at Pentecost as the story links with the grain  
harvest theme of the festival. Pentecost 2023, as a  
Christian feast, dates back to the first century. It  
occurs 50 days after Easter Sunday and falls on the  
ancient Jewish festival called the "feast of weeks".  
In the New Testament, Pentecost was the occasion of  
the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and  
other followers of Jesus Christ and therefore became a  
feast commemorating this occasion. The English word  
"Pentecost" is a translation of the Greek word  
pentekostos, which means "fifty".

It comes from the ancient Christian expression  
pentekoste hemera, which means fiftieth day  
(therefore applicable to the 50 days after the  
Resurrection of Christ). But Christians did not invent  
the phrase "fiftieth day". Rather, they borrowed it  
from Greek-speaking Jews who used the phrase to  
refer to a Jewish holiday.
